School Behaviour Principles Statement

The Governing Body of **St Michael's** is required by Section 88 of the Education and Inspections Act 2006 to make and review a written statement of behaviour principles.

At St Michael's, we believe that all members of our school community are entitled to feel safe, valued, and respected. We are committed to providing a positive and inclusive environment in which effective teaching and learning can take place, and where every pupil can flourish and reach their full potential.

Our Principles

- Every pupil has the right to learn, and every teacher has the right to teach without disruption.
- Pupils are encouraged to take responsibility for their own behaviour and to reflect on the impact of their actions on others.
- Positive behaviour is promoted through high expectations, encouragement, and recognition of achievement.
- Sanctions are applied fairly, proportionately, and consistently in line with the school's Behaviour Policy.
- The wellbeing, safety, and safeguarding of pupils are central to all decisions on behaviour.
- Bullying, harassment, and discrimination of any kind are unacceptable and will be challenged and addressed.
- Staff are expected to model respectful and professional behaviour at all times.
- Parents and carers are expected to support the school in upholding high standards of behaviour.

This statement provides the guiding framework for the school's **Behaviour Policy**, which sets out the detailed expectations, rewards, sanctions, and support strategies used to manage behaviour at St Michael's.
